

The excitement builds as over 500 are expected at B.C. Festival 2019, July 11 to 13 in Salmon Arm! All events will take place at the Shaw Centre Complex.

Great fun will be had! Square, round, clog, contra & line dancing are planned with free introductory sessions for the general public & Festival registrants. Fun extras include a local painters & sculptors display & a silent auction.

Now that caller/cuer sign-ups are closed, more than 55 entertainers have preregistered for the Festival, including a wonderful cross-section of B.C. callers & cuers plus ones from Alberta, Saskatchewan, Idaho and Washington.

The morning Festival program will include some workshops but the accent will be on having fun, such as exploring unusual square dance formations like hexagons.

Exciting news is that on Thursday afternoon, July 11, Elvis—yes, Elvis—is expected to be seen in the building and... he has learned to call!
